- 32 suggestions:Programs & resources (partner with banks) on how to budget (food, entertainment, etc.)
- 27 suggestions:Partner with other organizations in the community (Chamber of Commerce, Alberta Health, small businesses) for resources or to promote libraries' services
- 26 suggestions:Offer all free programming & services
- 25 suggestions:Provide free access to business services (printing, computers, scanning, Wifi, etc.) for all, especially job seekers (possibly with community sponsorship)
- 24 suggestions: Drop late fees/fines or waive for food donation (partner with food bank)
