- 1) Go to www.storybird.com.
- 2) Click "Sign up for free."
- 3) Choose the **STUDENT** account (you do not need an email address).
- 4) Fill in your age, username and password. Record these for later use.
- 5) **Skip** the avatar step, if you do not want to upload a picture.
- 6) Click on "Class" in the blue toolbar.
- 7) Enter the Class Access Code: XXXXX (This step will link you to the Library's account, so we can see your stories.) Press "Join Class."
- 8) Click on the assignment that is right for your AGE CATEGORY. (Ages 6-8yrs, 9-12 yrs. & 13-18 yrs.)
- 9) Read the instructions! Then click on "Do This Assignment."
- 10) You are now on the artwork page.
